Tuesday: 10:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

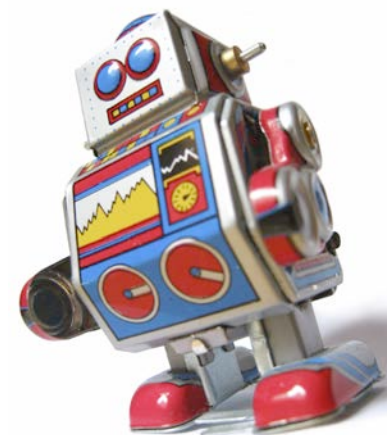
Wednesday: 10:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.
